Dr. Christine Miller is the Chairman and an Assistant Professor of the Department of Medicine and Orthopedics at the Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

Dr. Miller is a board-certified podiatrist and wound care specialist. She obtained her Doctor of Podiatric Medicine degree from Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine. She completed her residency in podiatric surgery at Virtua, West Jersey Health System in Camden, NJ.

Dr. Miller joined the TUSPM faculty in 2008. She is a fellow member of the Provost Teaching Academy (PTA) at Temple University. She received her Graduate Certification in Higher Education. Dr. Miller is a standing Member on the Committee of Academic and Professional Standards (CAPS) which establishes and enforces professional conduct and academic performance. She is also responsible for overseeing and developing the curriculum in the Medicine and Orthopedic Department.

She has experience in wound management and has facilitated a research study on the diabetic foot called "A Comparison Of Nail **Reduction Techniques for Diabetic** Patients. She teaches Radiology and serves as Course Director of Pediatrics, Infectious Disease and Fundamental of Podiatric Practices II.

Dr. Miller is well respected by her peers as well as her students. She has been awarded the teacher of the year award for demonstrating outstanding teaching and dedication to the student body. One of her most recent accolades is her recognition by the Provost of the University as

Student Spotlight

Chrisbel Dafeamekpor is a second year student at TUSPM. He graduated from Temple University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Biophysics. After college, he worked in the field of RF Engineering for about 4years and started a family, however the desire to be a physician kept gnawing at him. When asked how he was introduced to the field of Podiatric Medicine Chris replied "After the heads up about Podiatry by my friend, I decided to researched the field on my own. I visited the Foot and Ankle Institute at TUSPM to get more exposure to the field in order to make an educated decision as to whether this field was for me. He was shocked at how important the field is in today's team approach to healthcare. Chris learned that Podiatrist have balance between clinical care and surgical procedures; and that the pay and hours are comparable to a lot of other specialties. Podiatrist treat a range of patients with various issues and the patient satisfaction is very high.

As a podiatric medical student Chris realizes medical school is no walk in the park and TUSPM's curriculum is as intense. He is very ambitious and dedicated to both his studies and his family. He states that his "first year was an eye opener because it exposed him to the knowledge of the human composition in a

way physicians and healthcare workers utilize to do their jobs. Chris felt that his experience has been enlightening, and having to juggle medical school and family life with a new born baby is very challenging. However with a lot of discipline and time management he was able to excel. During his second year he has been able to build upon his experiences and the foundation that was established in the first year. Now he has a better appreciation of the knowledge that has been offered in the pursuit of this specialty and is able to piece together the bigger picture. He is a member of the following clubs, Stirling, Hartford, DiPriimio Society which students must maintain a 90 or above average in the anatomical sciences, Practice Management, SNPMA and the TUSPM Student Christian Clubs. Chris is also the recipient of the Hartford Memorial Award and various TUSPM scholarships.

After completing his residency, his career goal is to open up his own practice. Chris summarizes his desire to pursue the field of Foot and Ankle Surgery by reflecting on this famous poem by Robert Frost:

"The Road Not Taken". The poem speaks of a common scenario in life. A traveler has come to a crossroads and is forced to make a choice on which Foad," or path of life, he wants to choose. Both paths are inspected equally, and the traveler makes a choice and continues down the road. The author is happy with his choice; he decides to choose the road LESS traveled, and for that reason he is able to say with a sigh'in his old age that he chose the correct road, and that it has changed his life for the better; he is not just a regular Joe, and he has lived an adventure by choosing the less traveled road. He closes by saying "Many people have not taken this path to the field of Podiatry and it is really "a road not taken often" but it is a profession on the rise, it holds a lot of promise of



innovation and ingenuity in health care ."

Alumni Profile

Dr. Lawrence Levine, podiatrist and founder of Foot Health Centers, P.A., is based in New Jersey. Dr. Levine was recognized for developing the first podiatry program in the country for five Federally Qualified Health Center locations throughout Southern New Jersey. These facilities enable lower income individuals to receive the care that is needed. The physicians in his medical practice treat approximately 10,000 patient visits annually to both underserved and homebound patients.

Foot Health Centers, P.A., was founded in 1972 by Dr. Levine, now encompasses 13 doctors working out of 34 offices, nursing homes and assistant living facilities throughout Southern and Central NJ and Philadelphia. The practice's size enable it to offer state-of-the-art systems to expedite patient

diagnostic results and treatment at all of its health centers and office locations. Dr. Levine is afflicted with most of the major healthcare facilities in Central and Southern NJ.

Dr. Levine believes that due to the dramatic increase in obesity, diabetes and peripheral arterial disease in underserved population is an epidemic that directly impacts foot health. He states "it's rewarding to be able to provide high quality care to deserving patients who otherwise could not afford the care they need resulting from their diseases"

Dr. Levine has received numerous awards for research in podiatric medicine. He has also been honored as a Top Doc in several publications in both New Jersey and Pennsylvania. He received his Doctor of Podiatric Medicine degree from the

Pennsylvania College of Podiatric Medicine in 1971 which is now Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine. He has taught at the school since 1984 and is currently an adjunct professor at TUSPM. He is a fellow with the American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons and the American Board of Podiatric Orthopedics and Primary Podiatric Medicine. Dr. Levin is also a Fellow American College of Foot and Ankle Surgeons.

Dr. Levine is a well respected Podiatrist by his colleagues and students. He is well known within the communities in which he's served and has been an advocate for patients that can not afford the high quality care that they deserve. We are very grateful and honored that Dr. Levine remains a avid supporter of Temple .University School of Podiatric Medicine.

William Maul Measey Institute for Clinical Stimulation and Patient Safety

Temple's William Maul Measey Institute for Clinical Simulation and Patient Safety has earned reaccreditation as a Level I Education Institute by the American College of Surgeons (ACS).

Accreditation lasts for three years and represents the highest level of quality and standards for surgical education.

The Institute, which was one of the first such programs to receive ACS accreditation in 2006, provides a vital teaching and training function for medical students, residents, physicians, nurses and other health professionals. Programmable and anatomically detailed mannequins help teach a range of clinical and decision-making skills, while other modules and technologies allow participants to practice surgical skills, from suturing to laparoscopy. In many cases, standardized patients - many of whom have acting experience - are trained to simulate real-life medical situations, enabling learners to practice a variety of all-important patient care and communications skills.





Eighty-three (83) Temple physicians have been named to the Best Doctors in America® list for 2013. First Podiatric-Run Lymphedema and **Diabetic Ulcer** Clinic

The Temple University School of Podiatric Medicine (TUSPM), in collaboration with corporate partner Devon Medical Products, recently opened the city's first podiatric-run Lymphedema and Diabetic Ulcer Clinic at the Temple Foot and Ankle Institute, located on 8th Street, between Cherry and Race Streets. Lymphedema is swelling from fluid retention that is caused by blockage of the lymph vessels. Diabetic ulcers are wounds or open sores that will not heal or keep returning. Both conditions present a potentially serious risk of infection. The goal of new clinic is to prevent foot amputation by treating patients' symptoms early and quickly.
